The teaching of the Bible is not proved by just a few texts. Each text of Scripture should be understood in the light of the passage in which it is found. Sometimes a truth is stated clearly in a single verse. When this is the case, just one or two references are given. More usually the truths to which the catechism refer are woven throughout the whole Bible, and when this is so, several references are given.

A The covenant of works.

A Sin is any transgression of the law of God.

Q.29 What is meant by transgression?

A Transgression is doing what God forbids.

Q.30 What was the sin of our first parents?

A Our first parents ate the forbidden fruit.

Q.31 Why did Adam and Eve eat the forbidden fruit?

A Because they did not believe what God had said.

A The Devil tempted Eve and she gave the fruit to Adam.

A The anger and judgement of God.

Q.37 Can anyone go to heaven with this sinful nature?

A No. Our hearts must be changed before we can be fit for heaven.

Q.38 What is a change of heart called?

A Regeneration.

Q.39 Who can change a sinner's heart?

A The Holy Spirit alone.

Q.40 Why can no one be saved through the covenant of works?

A Because all have broken it, and are condemned by it.
